NCES Facts at a Glance

- Established in 1867 second oldest federal statistical agency
- Mission: "collect, report, analyze, and disseminate statistical data related to education in the United States and in other nations"
- Leading agency in access to public use and restricted data driving evidence-based policy



NCES Facts at a Glance

Activities include:

- Administering National Assessment of Educational Progress
- Reporting annually to Congress on Condition of Education
- Designing and implementing substantial program of surveys from early education through postsecondary
- Providing grants and technical assistance to states to build statewide longitudinal data systems (SLDS)
- Facilitating U.S. participation in international assessments (PISA, TIMSS)



COVID-19

Opportunities

- Added questions to surveys in field to gauge COVID-19
 education impact (e.g., National Postsecondary Student Aid
 Study—NPSAS, Beginning Postsecondary Student Survey--BPS
- Informed questions for Census Household Pulse Survey
- Conducting NAEP 2021 School Survey (school data)

Challenges

- School closures and impact on data collection
- Delays in surveys / assessments





Budget and Staff

Budget

NCES has experienced limited increases in funding since FY 2010

•FY 2010: \$108.52 M

•FY 2016: \$112.00 M

•FY 2021: \$111.50 M

In Real Dollars 15% Decade Decline

Long-term casualties—e.g., NSOPF

Staff

NCES has been constrained by FTE caps and staff attrition to carry out mission.

NCES currently has 95 staff (at FTE cap), decrease from 130 staff 25 years ago.





Bolstering NCES Data

- Staffing
 - Lift FTE caps
 - Provide direct line for IES / NCES similar to OIG and OCR within ED salaries and expenses
- Budget
 - Along with overall need for additional funding
 - \$5 million for School Pulse Survey
 - Increase for NAEP to keep up with inflation-adjusted costs





Ensuring NCES Autonomy and Independence

- Preserve presidential appointment and reinstate Senate confirmation for commissioner
- Provide NCES authority over its budget allocation, information technology, hiring, and publications





Ensuring NCES Autonomy and Independence

- Ensure that NCES controls the confidentiality of data and privacy protections
- Facilitate more direct access of the NCES Commissioner to the Secretary of Education
