Trump names Michael Kratsios as OSTP Director

On 22 December, Trump said he would nominate technologist Michael Kratsios to be director of OSTP and an assistant to the president for science and technology. Computer scientist Lynne Parker was named counselor to Kratsios, a new position, and executive director of the President's Council of Advisors on Science and Technology (PCAST).

For the past 3 years, Kratsios has been managing director of Scale AI, an AI infrastructure company. Parker retired in May after more than 2 decades as a faculty member and senior administrator at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville (UTK).

Kratsios must be confirmed by the Senate as director of OSTP, whose 100-plus member staff many on loan from other federal agencies—belies its tiny, \$10 million budget. *Full article*

Agency Releases

Bureau of Economic Analysis (DOC)

• Dec 27 - <u>U.S. International Investment Position, 3rd Quarter 2024</u>. The U.S. net international investment position, the difference between U.S. residents' foreign financial assets and liabilities, was –\$23.60 trillion at the end of the third quarter of 2024. Assets totaled \$37.86 trillion, and liabilities were \$61.46 trillion. At the end of the second quarter, the net investment position was –\$22.55 trillion (revised).



• Dec 18 – <u>U.S. Current-Account Deficit Widens in 3rd Quarter 2024</u>. The U.S. currentaccount deficit, which reflects the combined balances on trade in goods and services and income flows between U.S. residents and residents of other countries, widened by \$35.9 billion, or 13.1 percent, to \$310.9 billion in the third quarter of 2024. The widening reflected expanded deficits on secondary income, on primary income, and on goods. The thirdquarter deficit was 4.2 percent of current-dollar gross domestic product, up from 3.8 percent in the second quarter.

Bureau of Justice Statistics (DOJ)

- Dec 31 <u>Prisons Report Series: Preliminary Data Release, 2023</u>. The U.S. prison population was 1,254,200 at yearend 2023, a 2% increase from 2022 (1,230,100). At yearend 2023, persons sentenced to more than 1 year under the legal authority of state and federal correctional authorities accounted for 96% (1,210,300) of the total U.S. prison population. There were 1,124,400 males sentenced to more than 1 year in state or federal prison at yearend 2023 (93% of the U.S. prison population sentenced to more than 1 year). This represents an increase of 2% from yearend 2022 (1,103,200) but a decrease of 21% from 2013 (1,416,100).
- Dec 30 <u>Human Trafficking Incidents Reported by Law Enforcement, 2022 Statistical Tables</u>. U.S. law enforcement agencies reported an estimated 2,950 human trafficking incidents, of which 81% were incidents of sex trafficking and 19% were incidents of labor trafficking. About 70% of both sex and labor trafficking incidents involved a single victim. Two-thirds of sex trafficking (66%) and labor trafficking (68%) incidents were not cleared by law enforcement, meaning the incidents did not result in an arrest or exceptional clearance.



Bureau of Labor Statistics (DOL)

- Dec 20 <u>State Employment and Unemployment November 2024</u>. Unemployment rates were higher in November in 6 states, lower in 1 state, and stable in 43 states and the District of Columbia. Twenty-five states and the District had jobless rate increases from a year earlier, 6 states had decreases, and 19 states had little change. The national unemployment rate changed little over the month at 4.2 percent but was 0.5 percentage point higher than in November 2023.
- Dec 18 <u>Work Experience of the Population 2023</u>. There were 13.7 million people who experienced unemployment at some point during 2023, up by 747,000 from 2022. The proportion of the civilian noninstitutional population age 16 and over who worked at some time during the year increased by 0.4 percentage point to 64.2 percent in 2023.

Bureau of Transportation Statistics (DOT)

- Dec 18 <u>US Airlines gained \$2.1 billion in third quarter 2024</u>. U.S. scheduled passenger airlines reported a third-quarter 2024 after-tax net gain of \$2.1 billion and a pre-tax operating profit of \$3.1 billion. One year earlier, in the third quarter of 2023, the airlines reported an after-tax net gain of \$1.6 billion and a pre-tax operating gain of \$3.3 billion.
- Dec 11 <u>Air Travel Consumer Report: September 2024 Numbers and 3rd Quarter Numbers</u>. For September 2024, 0.6% of flights were cancelled, lower than the 1.2% cancellation rate for September 2023. For the first nine months of 2024, 1.6% of flights have been cancelled, equal to the rate posted during same period in 2023 and lower than the 2.2% cancellation rate posted for the first nine months of pre-pandemic 2019. DOT expects that airlines will operate flights as scheduled. DOT's Office of Aviation Consumer Protection (OACP) routinely monitors airlines' operations to ensure that airlines are not engaging in unrealistic scheduling of flights. The Department is currently pursuing enforcement action against several domestic airlines for unrealistic scheduling of flights.

Census Bureau (DOC)

- Dec 19 <u>Business Trends and Outlook Survey Data Release</u>. BTOS measures business conditions and projections on an ongoing basis. The BTOS includes data for multiunit/multilocation businesses. BTOS will continue to collect data complementary to key items found on other Economic surveys, such as revenues, employees, hours, and inventories. Additional details on <u>artificial intelligence</u> use and types used were added for one cycle and released March 28, 2024.
- Dec 17 <u>Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates for States, Counties and School</u> <u>Districts</u>. The median estimated poverty rate of children ages 5 to 17 in U.S. school districts in 2023 was 13.4%. The new data come from the 2023 <u>Small Area Income and Poverty</u> <u>Estimates</u> (SAIPE), which provide the only single-year income and poverty statistics for the nation's 3,143 counties and 13,137 school districts.

Economic Research Service (USDA)

• Dec 19 - <u>Trends in U.S. Fruit Consumption Relative to Recommendations in the Dietary</u> <u>Guidelines for Americans</u>. a stable share of the U.S. population—about 23 percent of children and 15 percent of adults—has been consuming enough fruit to satisfy Federal dietary recommendations since at least the mid-2000s. However, a growing share of the population is consuming below a quarter of the recommended amount. This group totaled almost 29 percent of children and 40 percent of adults at the beginning of the 2020s.



Dec 17 – The Economics of Cellular Agriculture. Cellular agriculture is the production of animal products, such as meat, seafood, milk, and eggs, with no or minimal use of animals. This report introduces the economics of cell-cultured and precision fermentation foods and documents the growth in the sector. Areas of emphasis are market drivers, structural aspects of the industry, the U.S. regulatory environment, government research funding, and market challenges as of 2023.

Energy Information Administration (DOE)

Dec 10 – Higher natural gas prices predicted, even with robust inventories through winter. It is expected that the average price of natural gas for the remainder of the winter heating season to be about 40% higher than the November spot price, despite expectations that U.S. natural gas inventories will remain higher than average throughout the winter. Although the price increase is notable, recent U.S. natural gas prices have been at near or record lows, and the increase will keep prices in line with previous end-of-winter prices. The United States started the winter season with 6% more natural gas in storage than average, and EIA forecasts in its December Short-Term Energy Outlook (STEO) that natural gas inventories will remain 2% above the five-year average at the end winter.

National Agricultural Statistics Service (USDA)

Dec 23 - United States Hog Inventory Up 1%. As of Dec. 1, there were 75.8 million hogs and pigs on U.S. farms, up 1% from December 2023, but down slightly from Sept. 1, 2024, according to the Quarterly Hogs and Pigs report.



Dec 16 – 2023 Census of Aquaculture Results. Total sales of aquaculture products in 2023 were \$1.9 billion, an increase of 26% from 2018, according to the 2023 Census of Aquaculture released today by USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. In 2023, there were 3,453 aquaculture farms with sales in the United States, up 18% from 2018. Five states - Mississippi, Washington, Louisiana, Florida and Alabama - accounted for 55% of aquaculture sales and 49% of aquaculture farms in 2023. Food fish and mollusks were the largest product categories for sales, with catfish and oysters the top species.

National Center for Education Statistics (IES)

- Dec 20 <u>Registration is open for NCES Data Users Conference</u>. The DUC will bring together data users, members of the research community, and policy makers to share about and learn from research and findings that use NCES's data sets, and to discuss strategies for analysis, data linking, data visualization, and reporting and applying federal statistics. The conference theme, *Responding to the "New Normal,"* will provide an opportunity to highlight research that addresses difficult district, state, and federal education decisions and for researchers to learn more about the on-the-ground education topics that policy makers would most like to learn more about. The event is virtual and will take place on February 11-13, 2025. The window for proposal submissions is closed and those who submitted a proposal have been notified.
- Dec 19 <u>2022–23 Common Core of Data (CCD) Graduates/Completers Public-Use Data</u> <u>Files, version 1a</u>. These data files are the product of the CCD data collection for the 2022– 23 school year. The unduplicated number of graduates/completers are reported at state, district, and school levels for the 12-month period from October 1, 2022, through September 30, 2023. The state- and district-level data are released as restricted-use (RUD) and public-use (PUB) files, while the school-level data are only released as a RUD file.

National Center for Health Statistics (CDC)

- Dec 19 <u>Drug Overdose Deaths in the United States, 2003–2023</u>. The age-adjusted rate of drug overdose deaths increased from 8.9 deaths per 100,000 standard population in 2003 to 32.6 in 2022; however, the rate decreased to 31.3 in 2023. Rates decreased between 2022 and 2023 for people ages 15–54 and increased for adults age 55 and older. From 2022 to 2023, rates decreased for White non-Hispanic people, while rates for other race and Hispanic-origin groups generally stayed the same or increased.
- Dec 17 Emergency Department Visits With an Influenza Test Ordered or Provided: United States, 2013-2022. The percentage of annual emergency department (ED) visits with an influenza test ordered or provided increased from 2.5% in 2013 to 10.9% in 2022. ED visits by children ages 0–5 years had the highest percentage of influenza tests ordered or provided in 2013 (8.6%) and 2022 (23.1%). Fever and cough were the most frequent firstlisted reasons for ED visits with an influenza test ordered or provided in both 2013 and 2022.

National Center for Science and Engineering Statistics (NSF)

- Dec 17 <u>Artificial Intelligence in the Business Sector: R&D, Use, and Impact on Employees</u>. The Annual Business Survey (ABS) collects indicators of AI research and development (R&D) activity (i.e., companies that report performing or funding AI R&D), AI usage, and AI impacts from domestic businesses with one or more employees. The Business Enterprise Research and Development (BERD) Survey estimates the amount of AI R&D performed by businesses with at least 10 employees. Overall, according to the ABS, 1% of businesses with at least one employee reported AI R&D activity for 2021. Within the manufacturing sector, the computer and electronics products subsector (North American Industry Classification System [NAICS] code 334) had one of the highest percentages of companies active in AI R&D at 6%.
- Dec 2 <u>2023 Doctorate Recipients from U.S. Universities</u>. The number of doctorate recipients from U.S. universities increased from 57,448 in 2022 to 57,862 in 2023. This small increase contrasted with the sharp 1-year increase (10%) in 2022, which followed 2 years of



decline due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This suggests that the number of doctorate recipients from U.S. universities may have stabilized following the onset of the pandemic. Between 2022 and 2023, the number of U.S. citizen and permanent resident doctorate recipients increased by 1% to 35,566. The number of doctorate recipients who were temporary visa holders decreased by 1% to 19,393 due to a decline in their numbers in S&E fields.

Statistics of Income (IRS)

• Dec 5 - <u>Partnership returns line item estimates (Publication 5035)</u>. The Partnership Returns Line Item Estimates (Publication 5035) presents estimates of frequencies of taxpayer entries recorded on the applicable lines of the forms and schedules filed with partnership returns. This publication also contains corresponding population estimates of dollar amounts recorded on those lines (as applicable). 2010 was the first year of availability for this data.
